Milk Production, Disposition, and Income 1998

Milk production increased 1 percent in 1998 to 157 billion pounds. The rate per cow at 17,192 pounds, was 321 pounds above 1997. The annual average number of cows on farms at 9.16 million head, was 94,000 less than 1997.

Cash receipts from marketings of milk during 1998 at \$24.3 billion dollars, was 16 percent above 1997. Producer returns averaged \$15.57 per hundredweight, 15 percent above 1997. Marketings totaled 156 billion pounds, 1 percent above 1997. Marketings include whole milk sold to plants and dealers as well as milk sold directly to consumers.

An estimated 1.36 billion pounds of milk were used on farms where produced, 2 percent less than 1997. Calves were fed 83 percent of this milk with the remainder consumed in producer households.
