North American Grain and Oilseed Crashings 2025 Summary

March 2026

Combined United States and Canadian Canola Crushed Up Slightly From 2024

This publication is a result of a joint effort by Statistics Canada and USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service to release the soybean and canola seed crushings information for both countries within one publication. United States soybean and oilseed crushings numbers for 2025 were previously released on March 2, 2026. Canadian soybean and oilseed crushings were released on February 25, 2026.

Combined United States and Canadian canola seeds crushed for crude oil was 15.0 million tons in 2025, up slightly from 2024. Crude oil production was 12.6 billion pounds, down less than 1 percent from 2024.
