PRODUCTION AND DISPOSITION OF CHICKENS AND EGGS*

This is one of a series of reports presenting revised estimates of farm production and disposition of agricultural products. This report on chickens and eggs is for the years 1925 through 1937. It covers the period during which monthly returns for sample flocks have been received from crop reporters. A subsequent report will carry the record back, as completely as is possible, to 1909 or earlier. Another report is to include data on turkey production.

The new series of estimates is comparable as to annual trend, but not as to level of absolute numbers, with estimates previously published. A considerable increase in the level of absolute production has been made, as the result of a reappraisal of the Federal Census production data used as the primary basis of these estimates. This has been done in the light of extensive experimental enumerations by the field statisticians of the Crop Reporting Board, of new and more complete information of hatchery production of chicks, of rural and urban consumption of poultry products, and of a re-examination and extensive analysis of sample flock data by size of flock, weighted by the recently available census breakdown by size groups of its 1930 and 1935 enumerations.

Basis of Estimates

Inventory Numbers

The accompanying estimates of inventory numbers of chickens on farms January 1 are based primarily upon the quinquennial census enumerations adjusted for changes in numbers between January 1 and the date of enumeration. These estimates cover only farm flocks as defined and enumerated by the United States Census, a farm being defined as a tract of land containing 3 or more acres, or producing agricultural products to the value of \$250 or more in the year enumerated.

Non-Farm Flocks

It is estimated that the number of chickens held in non-farm flocks is about 10 percent as many as are held in farm flocks, and that the relative production of chickens and eggs by non-farm flocks is in about the same proportion. The percentage of estimated numbers and production by non-farm flocks compared with farm flocks varies by regions, being estimated by major geographic areas; roughly as follows: North Atlantic 15 percent, East North Central 10 percent, West North Central 6 percent, South Atlantic 13 percent, South Central 11 percent and Far Western 6 percent.

Commercial Flocks

Commercial flocks are presumed to be included in the census figures under the census definition of a farm, and therefore to be included in these estimates.

Hens and Pullets on Hand January 1

This figure is based upon the proportion of potential layers (all hens and pullets) in the total estimated number of all chickens on hand at the time of the January 1 annual inventory, as shown by the returns for sample flocks.

Egg Production Per Hen and Pullet on Hand January 1

The published rate of annual production per layer is based upon the estimated annual total production of eggs, divided by the total number of hens and pullets on hand at the beginning of the year. This rate of production is less than the average production indicated by the monthly returns for farm flocks, showing production per hen and pullet of laying age on hand at the first of each month.

Eggs Produced

The basis of estimates of eggs laid annually is found in the monthly returns from about 20,000 Crop Correspondents reporting for their own flocks, and in studies of available data on farm, village and urban consumption of eggs. These data were considered in connection with the quinquennial returns of Federal Census enumerators on the production of eggs by farm flocks.

Chickens Raised

The estimates of numbers of chickens raised on farms are based primarily upon special studies considered in connection with the estimates of numbers of chickens raised as shown by United States Census enumerations. These studies include the number of baby chicks produced by commercial hatcheries and the proportion of these bought for farm flocks, the relation of numbers of young chickens on hand in sample farm flocks on June 1 (plus prior disposals and later hatchings) to

inventory numbers of older chickens on hand, and the probable total consumption of chickens by producers and by non-producers, as shown by various surveys.

Chickens Produced

This figure represents the number of chickens sold, plus the number consumed in farm households, plus or minus the gain or loss in inventory numbers during the year. It is the net annual farm production of chickens, being equivalent to the number raised during the year less death loss of chickens that were on hand at the beginning of the year. Chickens of the current year's hatchings that die are not included in the estimated number of chickens raised.

Annual Changes

The estimates of annual changes in numbers of chickens on hand and in production of chickens and eggs are based chiefly upon the changes in numbers on hand and of production in farm flocks as shown by the monthly and annual returns from crop reporters. These indications are supplemented by studies of the incomplete data available on commercial shipments and receipts of poultry products at leading markets, by annual surveys of numbers and production in various States, by State assessors' records, and by other State surveys.

Farm Consumption

The level of consumption of chickens and eggs in households of farm operators producing chickens has been fixed upon the basis of consumption reported quarterly since 1935 by crop correspondents. These reports, received on the first day of March, June, September, and December, cover consumption of chickens during the previous month and of eggs during the previous week. The annual changes in farm consumption from 1930 to 1935 were based upon the annual estimates of consumption by crop reporters and the annual changes in total production. From 1925 to 1929 they were based mainly upon changes in production and price.

Sales of Poultry Products

The estimates of sales are based mainly upon estimated production less farm utilization, checked so far as feasible against the scanty available data of commercial movement and of consumption by non-poultry producers.

Prices

Value per head of chickens on hand January 1 is based upon the annual average estimates of crop reporters. The average annual price per pound of chickens and the average annual price per dozen of eggs sold are computed from the monthly farm prices weighted by the estimated quantities sold each month.

Average farm price per head of chickens sold is computed from the average weight of chickens sold, times the annual average farm price per pound. The State average farm price per head of chickens sold is applied also to numbers of chickens produced to obtain the value of annual production. The average estimated value per head of chickens produced would be somewhat greater if allowance were made for the higher potential January 1 value of pullets retained for layers.

Death Loss

The estimated annual death loss of layers from 1925 to 1937 is based upon

judgment estimates received from crop reporters in 1928 and 1934 covering losses during the previous year, and upon studies found in the reports of Extension Poultry Specialists and other investigators. Future annual losses will be based upon quarterly returns from crop reporters beginning in 1938 giving number of layers lost from the laying flock during the previous month. All available records indicate a pronounced increase in the death loss in laying flocks during the past dozen years, and the revised estimates take this change into account. The annual loss of young birds from the current year's hatch has apparently declined considerably during the past decade. Since the estimates of chickens raised include only young chickens which have been consumed or sold during the current year or remain on hand at the close of the year, no deduction for loss of young chickens is necessary.

Per Capita Production and Consumption

The per capita consumption of chickens and eggs was obtained from the estimated sum of these products consumed in the households of farm producers, plus farm sales (except hatching eggs) plus 10 percent for non-farm flocks, plus or minus change in cold storage holdings; divided by the annual mid-year census estimates of the population of the Continental United States. Foreign trade is disregarded, being relatively insignificant. Per capita production as shown is computed from the quantity consumed in farm households, plus sold, plus or minus gain or loss in inventory holdings at close of year, divided by estimated mid-year population of the Continental United States.

Accuracy

The estimates in the following tables are believed to indicate within reasonable limits of accuracy the actual level of farm numbers, production, and disposal, and the direction and extent of the annual changes. There are no present means of determining with precision the degree of omission in the census figures of production, or the extent to which the sample flocks used as the principal indication of annual changes may be representative of the industry as a whole. The attainment of a greater degree of accuracy in the estimates will necessitate more adequate current surveys of numbers and production.
