The gross income from eggs, farm chickens, and commercial broilers in 1962 in the United States totaled \$2,939 million, compared with \$2,908 million in 1961, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Of the 1962 gross income, 60 percent was from eggs, 36 percent from commercial broilers, and 4 percent from farm chickens. In 1961, about 63 percent was from eggs, 33 percent from commercial broilers, and 4 percent from farm chickens. Cash receipts from sales of eggs, broilers, and farm chickens in 1962 accounted for \$2,830 million or 96 percent of the gross income. The remaining 4 percent represents the value of products consumed on farms where produced. Gross income from chickens, eggs, broilers and turkeys totaled \$3,291 million, compared with \$3,264 million in 1961. Gross income from sales of turkeys in 1962 was \$352 million.

EGG PRODUCTION HIGHER: Egg production in 1962 was 63,151 million eggs, 2 percent more than the 1961 production of 62,080 million. The number of layers on hand during 1962 averaged 298 million, compared with 295 million a year earlier. The rate of egg production per layer on hand during 1962 was 212 eggs, compared with 210 eggs per layer in 1961. Eggs sold, in 1962, totaled 60,106 million, compared with 58,714 million in 1961. Gross income from eggs in 1962 was 1,771 million, compared with 1,835 million in 1961.

FEWER FARM CHICKENS RAISED: The number of chickens raised on farms in 1962 was 318 million, compared with 346 million raised in 1961. Of the total raised on farms during 1962, about 94 percent were bought from hatcheries and about 6 percent were hatched on farms. Farm chicken production (raised minus lost) in 1962 amounted to 257 million birds, compared with 282 million birds a year earlier. Farm chickens sold in 1962 totaled 189 million --down 4 percent from the 197 million sold in 1961. Live weight of farm chickens sold in 1962 was 909 million pounds, compared with 1961 sales of 946 million pounds. Gross receipts from sales of farm chickens was \$92 million, compared with \$96 million in 1961. Gross income was \$117 million in 1962 and \$124 million in 1961.

EGG PRICES LOWER IN 1962--FARM CHICKEN PRICES SAME: The average price for eggs sold in 1962 was 33.7 cents per dozen, compared with 35.5 cents in 1961. Monthly egg prices in 1962 for January through August and also in October were lower than the same months a year earlier, while in September, November, and December monthly prices were higher. The average price per pound live weight of farm chickens sold in 1962 was 10.1 cents, the same as in 1961. Farm chicken prices in 1962 averaged lower than in 1961 for January through July. From September through December farm chicken prices were higher than a year earlier.

COMMERCIAL BROILER PRODUCTION AT RECORD HIGH: A total of 2,026 million commercial broilers were produced in 1962, an increase of 2 percent from 1961 and the largest production of record. The average price received by producers for their record crop was 15.2 cents per pound live weight, 1.3 cents per pound

higher than in 1961. Gross income from broilers was 11 percent more than a year earlier. Gross income was \$1,050 million in 1962 and \$949 million in 1961. Georgia led all States in the number of broilers produced in 1962, with 17 percent of the Nation's total, followed by Arkansas with 12 percent, Alabama with 11 percent, North Carolina with 10 percent, Mississippi with 7 percent, Texas and Maryland with 6 percent each, Delaware with 5 percent, and Maine and California with 3 percent each. These 10 States accounted for 80 percent of the 1962 broiler production in the United States.

CHICKEN INVENTORY DECREASES: Chickens on farms January 1, 1963 (excluding commercial broilers) totaled 365 million, 1 percent less than a year earlier. Of the 347 million hens and pullets on hand, 61 percent were pullets and 39 percent were hens. A year earlier the relationship of pullets to hens was 63 percent pullets and 37 percent hens. The number of pullets on farms January 1 1963 is estimated at 213 million--a decrease of 3 percent from a year earlier. Hens totaled 134 million, 3 percent more than a year earlier.

HOME CONSUMPTION OF CHICKENS AND EGGS LOWER: Chickens consumed on farms where produced totaled 71 million birds and 255 million pounds during 1962, compared with 78 million birds and 277 million pounds in 1961. Eggs consumed on farms where produced amounted to 3,045 million eggs in 1962--10 percent less than in 1961.

DEATH LOSS: Death loss during 1962 of chickens on hand January 1, 1962 was 16.6 percent, compared with 17.7 percent a year earlier.

TOTAL SALES OF FARM CHICKENS AND COMMERCIAL BROILERS UP: Combined sales of farm chickens and commercial broilers in 1962 totaled 7,828 million pounds--up 1 percent from the combined sales in 1961. Total value of birds sold in 1962 was \$1,143 million, compared with \$1,045 million a year earlier. This was an increase of 9 percent. Commercial broiler sales were 88 percent of the total pounds sold in both 1962 and 1961. The average price per pound live weight received for the combined broiler and farm chicken sales in 1962 was 14.6 cents, compared with 13.4 cents a year earlier.

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
