CHICKENS, EGGS, AND BROILERS

Production, Disposition, Cash Receipts and Gross Income by States, 1969-70

Gross income from the production of eggs, chickens and broilers in 1970 totaled \$3,771 million compared with \$3,941 million in 1969 according to the Crop Reporting Board. Of the 1970 gross income, 58 percent was from eggs, 39 percent from broilers, and 3 percent from other chickens. These percentages have not changed since 1967. Cash receipts from eggs, broilers and chickens marketed in 1970 were \$3,731 million, accounting for 99 percent of gross income; the remaining 1 percent represented the value of poultry products consumed on farms where produced. Gross income from turkeys in 1970 totaled \$492 million, bringing the combined income from eggs, broilers, chickens, and turkeys to \$4,263 million compared with \$4,393 million in 1969.

EGG PRODUCTION UP: The 1970 production of 70,312 million eggs was up 2 percent from the 69,086 million produced in 1969. Layer numbers during the year averaged 322.3 million, compared with the 1969 average of 314.1 million. The annual average rate of lay per layer was 218 eggs in 1970 compared with 220 eggs in 1969. Eggs sold totaled 69,250 million, up 2 percent from 1969. Gross income from eggs was \$2,202 million, down 4 percent from the 1969 total of \$2,300 million, because lower egg prices in 1970 more than offset the increase in the number of eggs sold.

MORE CHICKENS RAISED: Chickens raised in 1970 (excluding broilers) totaled 330 million, 6 percent more than in 1969. Chicken production (home consumption plus sales adjusted for change in inventory) was 267 million birds weighing 1,197 million pounds liveweight, compared with 253 million birds and 1,146 million pounds liveweight in 1969. Cash receipts in 1970 were \$101 million, compared with \$102 million a year earlier. Gross income was \$107 million, down from the 1969 total of \$110 million.

BROILER PRODUCTION ABOVE 1969 RECORD: Production of broilers in 1970 totaled 2,984 million birds, 7 percent more than were produced in 1969. Gross income at \$1,462 million is 5 percent less than the 1969 total of \$1,531 million.

PRICES DECLINE: Eggs averaged 37.6 cents per dozen in 1970 compared with 40.0 cents in 1969. Chickens sold in 1970 averaged 8.8 cents per pound liveweight, down from the 1969 average of 9.7 cents. Broilers in 1970 averaged 13.5 cents per pound, down 1.7 cents from the year earlier average.

FARM CONSUMPTION OF EGGS AND CHICKENS: The number of chickens consumed on farms where produced totaled 21.0 million, 11 percent less than in 1969 while egg consumption of 1,062 million was down 9 percent from the 1,172 million eggs consumed in 1969.

DEATH LOSS: Death loss of chickens on hand January 1, 1970 was 14.5 percent compared with 14.0 percent a year earlier.

CHICKENS AND BROILERS COMBINED: Sales of chickens and broilers in 1970 totaled 11,953 million pounds compared with 11,099 million pounds in 1969, an 8 percent increase. The total value of sales was \$1,562 million, down 4 percent from the 1969 value. The value of broiler sales amounted to 94 percent of the total, the same as in 1968 and 1969. The price per pound liveweight for broilers and chickens combined averaged 13.1 cents in 1970 compared with 14.7 cents in 1969.
