CHICKENS, EGGS, AND BROILERS

Production, Disposition, Cash Receipts and Gross Income by States, 1968-69

Gross income from the production of eggs, chickens and broilers in 1969 totaled \$3,936 million compared with \$3,383 million in 1968, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Of the 1969 gross income, 58 percent was from eggs, 39 percent from broilers, and 3 percent from other chickens. The breakdown was the same in 1968. Cash receipts from eggs, broilers and other chickens marketed in 1969 were \$3,890 million, accounting for 99 percent of gross income; the remaining 1 percent represented the value of poultry products consumed on farms where produced. Gross income from turkeys in 1969 totaled \$453 million, bringing the combined income from eggs, broilers, chickens, and turkeys to \$4,389 million compared with \$3,799 million in 1968.

EGG PRODUCTION SLIGHTLY LOWER: The 1969 production of 68,925 million eggs was slightly less than the 69,270 million produced in 1968. Layer numbers during the year averaged 313.3 million, compared with the 1968 average of 315.0 million. The annual average rate of lay per layer was 220 eggs in 1969, the same as in 1968 average. Eggs sold totaled 67,753 million, slightly less than sales in 1968. Gross income from eggs was \$2,294 million, 17 percent above the 1968 income of \$1,959 million because of higher egg prices in 1969.

MORE CHICKENS RAISED: Chickens raised in 1969 (excluding broilers) totaled 312 million, 3 percent above 1968. Chicken production (home consumption plus sales adjusted for change in inventory) was 253 million birds weighing 1,210 million pounds live weight, compared with 248 million birds and 1,158 million pounds live weight in 1968. Cash receipts in 1969 were \$103 million, compared with \$90 million a year earlier. Gross income was \$111 million, up from the 1968 total of \$98 million.

PRICES UP: Eggs averaged 40.0 cents per dozen in 1969 compared with 34.0 cents a year earlier. Chickens sold in 1969 averaged 9.7 cents per pound live weight, up from the 1968 average of 8.2 cents. Broilers in 1969 averaged 15.2 cents per pound, up 1.0 cent from the year earlier average.

BROILER OUTPUT ABOVE 1968 RECORD: Production of broilers in 1969 totaled 2,788 million birds, 6 percent larger than the 2,621 million birds produced in 1968. Gross income at \$1,531 million is 15 percent above the 1968 total of \$1,326 million.

FARM CONSUMPTION OF EGGS AND CHICKENS: The number of chickens consumed on farms where produced totaled 23.8 million, 10 percent less than in 1968, while egg consumption of 1,172 million was down 16 percent from the 1,393 million eggs consumed in 1968.

DEATH LOSS of chickens on hand January 1, 1969 was 14.1 percent compared with 12.7 percent a year earlier.

CHICKENS AND BROILERS COMBINED: Sales of chickens and broilers in 1969 totaled 11,107 million pounds compared with 10,429 million pounds a year earlier, a 6 percent increase. The total value of sales was \$1,634 million, up 15 percent from the 1968 value. The value of broiler sales amounted to 94 percent of the total in both 1968 and 1969. The average price per pound live weight for broilers and chickens combined averaged 14.7 cents in 1969 compared with 13.6 cents in 1968.
