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Prices for low/medium heat nonfat dry milk (NDM) moved higher across all facets of the range and mostly price series in the West, as upward price momentum since mid-October continues. Domestic demand is stronger this week. Demand from international buyers is steady. Among NDM manufacturers, spot load availability of low/medium heat NDM varies widely. Stocks are comparatively tighter in the southwest part of the region. Similarly, production schedules are comparatively more limited in the southwest part of the region. Production paces vary from steady to lighter in the region. High heat NDM prices moved higher. Production paces and demand are both mixed.
