Low/medium heat nonfat dry milk (NDM) prices moved lower across all facets of the range and mostly price series in the West. Domestic demand is steady to weaker. Stakeholders indicate export demand is steady to moderate and Mexican purchasing interest is stronger. Manufacturers relay steady production schedules and Class IV milk draws. Both ends of the high heat NDM price range moved lower. Demand is steady to moderate. High heat NDM production varies. Some manufacturers relay steady high heat NDM production. A few manufacturers relay slotting in high heat NDM production only upon request and price agreement.
