



Nonfat Dry Milk - West U.S.

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Dairy Market News

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Prices in the West for low/medium heat nonfat dry milk (NDM) moved higher on the bottom end of the range, while the top end is unchanged this week. Prices for the mostly price series moved 1 cent higher on both ends. Demand is stronger from both domestic and international buyers. Production schedules are mostly steady. NDM spot load availability is mixed. In some cases, manufacturers convey spot loads are extremely limited for the remainder of the month. High heat NDM prices moved higher on the bottom end and are unchanged on the top end. Demand is steady. Production schedules are mixed with some manufacturers running high heat production intermittently to accommodate requests.
