CELERY: Harvest is active in the Florida Everglades, and light in the Central area. Crop condition is mostly good, with sizes running heavy to 2 - 2 1/2 dozen stalks per crate. Quality of current supply is mostly good.

Transplanting of California celery was delayed by heavy rainfall in mid-February. Harvest continued in the southern district.

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
