CATTLE ON FEED IN 7 STATES UP 7 PERCENT


Cattle and calves on feed November 1 for slaughter market in the 7 States preparing monthly estimates totaled 8.22 million, a 7 percent increase from a year ago and 1 percent above November 1, 1982, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

MARKETINGS of fed cattle during October totaled 1.66 million, an increase of 2 percent from last year and up 9 percent from October 1982.

PLACEMENTS of cattle and calves on feed in the 7 States were 2.55 million, up $\frac{1}{3}$ percent from October 1983 but 2 percent below two years ago. NET PLACEMENTS of 2.44 million were up 3 percent from 1983 but 3 percent below $\frac{1}{1982}$.

OTHER DISAPPEARANCE totaled 110 thousand compared with 102 thousand during October 1983 and 83 thousand two years ago.
