## Cattle on Feed

Released September 18,1991, by the Agricultural Statistics Board. Estimates are for 7 monthly reporting States and refer to September 1 and the month of August.

Cattle on Feed in 7 States up Slightly from Last Year


Cattle and calves on feed September 1, 1991, for slaughter market totaled 7.01 million head, up slightly from a year ago and 6 percent above September 1, 1989. This is the largest September number on feed since 1987.

Marketings of fed cattle during August totaled I.71 million, up 3 percent from last year, and l percent above two years ago.

Placements of cattle and calves on feed in the 7 States during August totaled 1.44 million head, down 17 percent from last year, and 12 percent below August 1989. This is the lowest number placed during August since 1981. Net Placements of 1.37 million for August were also down 17 percent from last year and 12 percent from 1989.

Other Disappearance totaled 67,000 head compared to 82,000 in August 1990 and 76,000 in August 1989.
