CATTLE ON FEED IN 7 STATES -- 8 PERCENT MORE THAN LAST YEARS RECORD LOW:

Cattle and calves on feed September 1 for slaughter market in the 7 States preparing monthly estimates totaled 6,432,000 head, up 8 percent from last year's record low number for September 1 but still 6 percent less than the same date in 1974, according to the Crop Reporting Board. The number on feed September 1 was above last year in 5 of the 7 States.

August placements of cattle and calves on feed in the 7 States totaled 1,404,000, 10 percent more than last year and 16 percent above the same month in 1974. Placements were above last year in 6 of the 7 States.

Fed cattle marketed during August totaled 1,586,000, 31 percent more than 1975 and 22 percent more than 2 years ago. Marketings were above August 1975 in all States except Arizona which was unchanged.

Other disappearance during August totaled 52,000, compared with 43,000 in the same month a year ago.

Estimates in this Cattle on Feed Report are based on data provided voluntarily by cattle feeders. The Statistical Reporting Service maintains an up-to-date list of cattle feeders stratified by feedlot capacity. Data are collected by mail and by personal and telephone interviews on or about the 1st day of each survey period. Survey procedures are designed to obtain reports from all feeders in the larger size strata, and feeders in the small size strata are sampled. Of the total inventory of cattle on feed for this report 73 percent was actually reported in the survey.
