
CATTLE ON FEED IN 7 STATES UP 4 PERCENT

Cattle and calves on feed June 1 for slaughter market in the 7 States preparing monthly estimates totaled 7.36 million head, up 4 percent from a year ago and 7 percent more than June 1, 1980, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

MARKETINGS of fed cattle during May totaled 1.41 million, a 1 percent increase from last year and up 2 percent from May two years ago.

PLACEMENTS of cattle and calves on feed in the 7 States during May totaled 1.85 million, a 14 percent increase from last year and 15 percent more than May 1980. This is the highest May placements in the 7 States since 1978. NET PLACEMENTS of 1.71 million for May are 20 percent greater than last year and 21 percent more than May two years ago.

OTHER DISAPPEARANCE totaled 143 thousand compared with 195 thousand in May 1981 and 208 thousand during May 1980.

THE STATE STATISTICAL OFFICES MAINTAIN AN UP-TO-DATE LIST OF CATTLE FEEDERS STRATIFIED BY FEEDLOT CAPACITY. DATA ARE COLLECTED BY MAIL AND BY PERSONAL AND TELEPHONE INTERVIEWS ON OR ABOUT THE 1ST DAY OF EACH SURVEY PERIODS SURVEY PROCEDURES ARE DESIGNED TO OBTAIN REPORTS FROM ALL FEEDERS IN THE LARGER SIZE STRATA, AND FEEDERS IN THE SMALL SIZE STRATA ARE SAMPLED. OF THE TOTAL INVENTORY OF CATTLE ON FEED ESTIMATED ON THIS REPORT TO PERCENT WAS ACTUALLY REPORTED IN THE SURVEY.
