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FEBRUARY 1989 HIGHLIGHTS

BUTTER production was 125 million pounds, 7 percent above February 1988 but 3 percent below January 1989.

AMERICAN TYPE CHEESE production totaled 209 million pounds, 6 percent below February 1988 and 7 percent below January 1989.

TOTAL CHEESE output (excluding cottage cheese) during February was 420 million pounds, 2 percent below February 1988 and 8 percent below January 1989.

CREAMED COTTAGE CHEESE production was 46.9 million pounds, 13 percent below February 1988 and 1 percent below January 1989.

LOWFAT COTTAGE CHEESE production was 24.1 million pounds, 11 percent above February 1988 and virtually unchanged from January 1989.

CANNED EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED WHOLE MILK production, at 41.5 million pounds was virtually unchanged from February 1988 but 7 percent below January 1989.

FROZEN DESSERTS: (Comparisons with February 1988)
Ice Cream (hard) -- 59.0 million gallons, down 7 percent.
Ice Milk -- 24.1 million gallons, up 13 percent.
Sherbet -- 3.46 million gallons, up 9 percent.

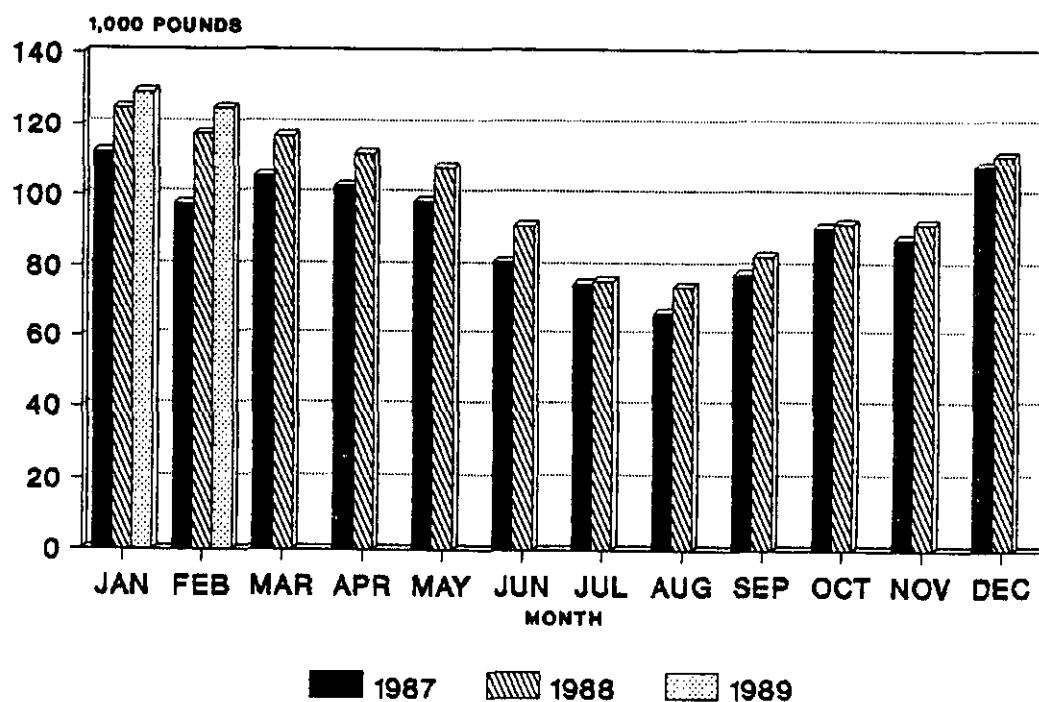
DRY MILK PRODUCTS: (Comparisons with February 1988)
Nonfat dry milk for human food -- 85.6 million pounds, down slightly.
Dry whole milk -- 13.9 million pounds, up 4 percent.
Dry buttermilk -- 5.75 million pounds, up 1 percent.
