COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING AUGUST 2024

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): For the most part, August was pretty much normal for August. Hot, humid days mixed with scattered thunderstorms and mid to late month remnants of Hurricane Debby pass providing warm winds and plenty of rain. Colonies continue to raise brood and there were a few scattered reports of late swarming resulting in a few of those beekeepers having to locate a new, mated queen. In most areas of the District, pollen and nectar sources were scarce due to the normal dirth. Beekeepers checked on bees, a few pulled off honey, a few started mite treatments, a few attended fairs competing for ribbons. Despite the reduction in bloom, the following were blooming in August: clover, red and white clovers, thistle, joe-pye weed, milkweed, clethra, mountain mint, aster, buckwheat, ironweed, and various other wildflowers.

ALABAMA: Alabama experienced generally above average temperatures and below average precipitation for most of the month of August. This meant that beekeepers needed to be diligent over their colony's food stores, although few beekeepers fed. Pollen foraging continued. Goldenrod started to bloom in very northern locations; otherwise, hibiscus, sneezeweed, rudbeckia, boneset, and kudzu bloomed in various locations. Beekeepers continued to pull supers and extract honey; beekeepers also monitored and treated for varroa. Small hive beetle populations were reported as high in several locations.

ARIZONA: The month of August 2024 was dry and sunny throughout most of the month. Many of the days were above 100°F. According to the U.S. Weather Service, Arizona showed 1.62 inches of total precipitation for the month. This is down .48 inches from the normal month-to-date. The U.S Drought Monitor Service still considers Arizona to be in Moderate Drought conditions throughout most of the state with few areas being in Severe Drought.

The dry conditions of this month caused the loss of some hives. This decreased the amount of honey production in the drier areas of the state. The demand for honey once again remains good throughout most of the state. The drier conditions of the month and reduction of some hives keeps the demand high. Some citrus exists, but cotton and alfalfa were the main pollen sources.

ARKANSAS: During the month of August temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was below normal across most of the same area. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, the northern part of the state had normal to abnormally dry conditions. Central and Southern Arkansas had abnormally dry to moderate drought conditions.

CALIFORNIA: No report issued.

FLORIDA: Temperatures were above normal for the month. Precipitation was below normal in the Panhandle and in parts of northern and eastern Florida. Hurricane Debby made landfall on August 5th in the Big Bend area with torrential rainfall but much of the rain was east of the hurricane. Much of the western Panhandle area received little rain and parts were in drought conditions by later in the month. Excessive rainfall was responsible for some hive losses due to flooding in Western, Central and Eastern Florida. Too much rain also washed away many of the blooms from some potential sources of nectar such as melaleuca, cabbage palm and firethorn in Central and South Florida. Supplemental feeding was necessary for much of the month for many areas including most of the Panhandle but also in Central and South Florida. Heat combined with a lack of natural food sources placed many hives in stressed conditions resulting in few treatments for mites or beetles. Bee health was considered to be average or slightly below in many areas. There was almost no honey produced for commercial sale and in many cases not even enough to sustain the hives. Some honey, particularly tupelo, was still stored at the end of the month as offered prices were not attractive to producers. Demand for Florida honey was moderate to fairly light at steady to slightly lower prices. Brazilian Pepper will be the next major source of honey production with bloom expected to start in the south by the middle of September.

GEORGIA: There was warmer than average temperatures in August with highs around 88 F and lows around 68 F. This month had less rainfall than pervious years, but this has not had any affect on the bees. There has not been any reports of loss of bees or queen bees. Older queens continue to produce many eggs. Local Tupelo honey sold for \$6.00 - \$7.00 per pound, Wildflower \$10.00 per pound and Sourwood honey sold \$7.00 - \$!6.00 per pound.

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of August temperatures were average in Idaho. Precipitation in Idaho was below normal. Utah had temperatures that were average and precipitation that was above normal. Colorado had average temperatures across the whole state, Precipitation for Colorado was below normal for August.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in August Southern Idaho had abnormally dry to moderate drought and Northern Idaho had moderate to severe drought. Utah is currently under abnormally dry to moderate drought conditions. Colorado had normal soil moisture to severe drought.

ILLINOIS: Temperatures for the month of August were normal with a lack of rainfall in most parts of the state. Beekeepers continue extracting honey from their hives and check for mites. Beekeepers also report lots of foliage for their bees to feed on, such as goldenrod, basswood, sweet clover and aster, as they bring nectar back to the hives. Beekeepers report no problems with insects. Beekeepers report that production was good. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

INDIANA: Temperatures for the month of August were normal for the state with a slight lack of rain in most parts of the state. Beekeepers report that their bees continue to feed on foliage, such as alfalfa. Beekeepers report their bees in good condition as they swarm for cleansing flights as well as starting other hives. Most beekeepers report that they have seen mites, but at this part of the season they haven't become a problem. A few beekeepers said they started poorly, but that production has increase appreciably. Demand for honey is good and that sales are up at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.

KENTUCKY: The month of August in Kentucky began with unseasonably cool temperatures as a low-pressure system over the Midwest meant a cold front for the Ohio River Valley, bringing storms and cooler temperatures in the 40sF. Honeybees were able to benefit from copious goldenrods, sunflowers, wingstems, Japanese knotweed, asters, ironweed, smartweed and other less welcome flowering species such as ragweed and thistle. Unfortunately, the cooler temperatures came to an end with higher-than-normal temperatures, with the result being that in some places, records were

broken for the hottest day. From Aug. 23-31st, most places were in 90+F or higher. Louisville experienced 102F on the 29th and 100F on the 31st. Lexington broke its 70+ record for hottest day on Aug. 30, when it reached 98F. This heat impacted the floral availability as many flowering species did not have enough rain to sustain them.

LOUISIANA: There was plenty of rain fall with an average of 11 rainy days. Average temperatures ranged from 75 to 91 F. Overall Louisiana bee colonies are relatively stable. Local wildflower honey sales were reported at \$2.50 - \$3.00 per pound.

MICHIGAN: Fall is just around the corner in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. August brought more heat and humidity with most areas continuing to deal with drought. Rain came in the form of strong storms with localized heavy rains and high winds. Most of the storms resulted in widespread power outages. Our short honey flow is wrapping up with most beekeepers harvesting their honey and treating for mites. Varying reports from beekeepers with many having banner years and others left with nothing. Many reported that the bees just refused to go up into the supers. It's time to start feeding and making necessary preparations for winter. A minimum of 100 pounds of stored honey is the rule in the U.P. to at least have a chance of making it through to spring. Bears are becoming more and more bold as they also prepare for winter. Wildflower honey is retailing for \$9.00/pound.

MINNESOTA: During the month of August temperatures were average across the whole state. Precipitation for August was normal for the North end of the state, the South end of the state saw above normal.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in August, Northern Minnesota had no drought to abnormally dry conditions and Southern Minnesota had no drought.

MISSISSIPPI: August weather averaged lows of 71 and highs of 92 F, with about 5.13 inches of rainfall. The weather is typical and supports the health of bee colonies. Local Wildflower honey sold for \$2.50 - \$3.00 per pound and Tupelo \$7.00 - \$8.50 per pound.

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: No report issued.

NEW YORK: Some cooler days at the end of the month of August after the warm humid weather occured. Possibly due to an unsettled Spring with a late frost and damage to Black Locust and Basswood blossoms, some NY upstate beekeepers are reporting a later harvest with reduced crop, and with less light grade honey. Reports of European foulbrood, a possible stress ailment in the Spring, set back some colonies, causing a slow build up in population. Goldenrod, Japanese Knotweed, Purple Loosestrife in bloom; beekeepers are hopeful for an adequate Fall nectar flow. Varroa mite treatments have commenced. Honey demand and prices good.

NORTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: In August, the weather started mixed with rain in some areas, others dry, moisture supplies were generally adequate. By mid-August the sunflower were at about 75% full bloom. By the end of the month sunflower bloom was completed and the second cutting of the alfalfa was nearly complete, stock water and soil moisture was good.

OHIO: The Ohio Drought Monitor shows Southeastern Ohio in Extreme Drought. Most of Ohio is very dry with very few areas receiving rain in the past 3 weeks. Southwest Ohio received enough rain to keep pollinator flowers producing nectar and pollen. Those landowners who have either acreage of flowers or prairies with a healthy mix of flowers are still providing nutrients for honeybees. Late soybeans planted after wheat harvest are still producing nectar for bees. Alfalfa being grown for hay and not cut at 10% bloom is providing a major honey crop in the southwest quadrant of Ohio. Feral Honeybees are aggressively chewing and killing varroa mites, keeping the colony populations healthy. Many feral swarms caught in April have produced 100 surplus pounds of honey for the beekeeper plus what the colony needs for overwintering. Feral honeybees are moving into 100s of houses in Ohio with the need to have a beekeeper do a cutout to rescue the colony. Honey prices have remained stable. \$5.50 to \$6.00 per pound wholesale, \$9.00 to \$16.00 per pound retail.

Beeswax is selling for \$8.00 to \$15.00 per pound. Heat and Humidity hung over Ohio most of the month with 29 days of temperatures at or above 90 degrees F in Columbus Ohio. Cincinnati and Cleveland also received Heat Advisories with temperatures exceeding 90 degrees, in fact on August 30 it was 98 degrees in Cincinnati which has not occurred since 1962. The average high is 84 degrees. This doubles the number of 90-degree days from last year when August had 15 days above 90 degrees compared to 30 in 2024.

Reports of honeybees eating their stores has occurred while robbing has been common. Much of Ohio is very dry with brown turfgrass and wilted wildflowers along trails. Droughts prevent flowers from producing surplus nectar and pollen which adds more stress for pollinators. Many colonies have swarmed or absconded due to high varroa mite loads and stress although west central Ohio still seems to have some moisture. Beekeepers need to be monitoring mite levels and stored food as winter bees are now being produced.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of August temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was well above normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Eastern and Central Oklahoma had normal to moderately dry conditions. There were moderate to extreme drought conditions across Western parts of the state.

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: West Columbia Farmer's Market reported local honey sales. 4-1 gallon sold for \$180, 12-1 quart sold for \$110-\$140, 12-1 pint sold for \$70.00 and Honey Bears 12 count- 12 oz sold for \$40.00.

TENNESSEE: August was dry in Tennessee. Beekeepers at the higher altitudes reported a better than average harvest of Sourwood honey. There has been an average flow of goldenrod and aster nectar across most of the state. There have not been any big losses of colonies in August.

TEXAS: During the month of August temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during August was below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, the Coastal plains had normal soil moisture. Central and West Central Texas had abnormally dry to severe drought conditions. The Trans Pecos area had severe to exceptional drought conditions.

Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

WASHINGTON: August saw more hot, dry weather. Onion and potato had begun followed by Barlett pears and early apples. As the month progressed the temperatures dropped a bit with some precipitation West of the Cascades. Vegetable harvest built to a peak despite some cooler weather. Later in the month the temperatures warmed back up, but little or no rain was received in Central Washington. Gala harvest was well underway as other early blocks were starting up. Preparations for fall planting began in some areas.

WISCONSIN: Temperatures for the month of August were normal with very little rain. Beekeepers for the state report very satisfactory health of their hives. Some beekeepers report a good honey flow, but others say that production overall was poor. Beekeepers report more than enough wild foliage for their bees and noticed that this particular year and season their bees are feeding on goldenrod, catmint, apple mint, all the other mints, thyme, black snakeroot, coneflowers, early asters, goldenrod, all the prairie plants, fall raspberries, squash, cucumbers, and other miscellaneous flowers. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
