TURKEYS RAISED IN 1987 UP 16 PERCENT

Turkeys raised in the United States during 1987, at 240 million, were 16 percent greater than the 207 million raised during 1986.

North Carolina ranked first in the number raised with 48.4 million followed by Minnesota with 40.5 million; California with 25.5 million; Arkansas with 18.0 million; Virginia with 16.2 million and Missouri with 15.5 million. These States account for over two-thirds of the turkeys produced in the United States during 1987.

TURKEY GROWERS PLAN 8 PERCENT INCREASE IN 1988

Turkey growers in 20 major producing States intend to raise 250 million turkeys in 1988, up 8 percent from the 231 million in 1987.

The number of turkeys actually raised in 1988 may vary from growers' intentions shown in this report depending on feed costs, supply of hatching eggs, cost of poults, and prices growers receive for turkeys during the next few months.

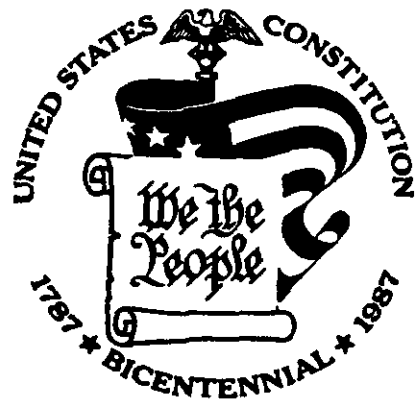
