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SOYBEANS HARVESTED FOR BEANS
ACREAGE, YIELD, AND PRODUCTION
1949 AND 1950
BY COUNTIES FOR 18 PRINCIPAL STATES

Estimates of acreage, yield, and production of soybeans harvested for beans, by counties in 18 soybean producing States, are herewith assembled for the crop years 1949 and preliminary 1950. These estimates are a breakdown of the official State estimates as published in the Annual Summary of Crop Production issued in December 1950, and were prepared by the Agricultural Statisticians in the respective States. The 1950 soybean production in the 18 States shown herein accounts for 98 percent of the United States total although production is estimated in 29 States.
