BY COUNTIES FOR 18 PRINCIPAL STATES

The Crop Reporting Board has assembled the following county estimates of acreage, yield and production of soybeans harvested for beans for 1947, and 1948 preliminary in 18 soybean producing States. These estimates are a breakdown of the official State estimates and were prepared by the Agricultural Statisticians in the respective States. The 1948 soybean production in the 18 States shown herein accounts for nearly 99 percent of the United States total although production is estimated in 29 States.
