SOYBEANS HARVESTED FOR BEANS

Acreage, Yield and Production

1944 AND 1945

BY COUNTIES FOR 18 PRINCIPAL STATES

The Crop Reporting Board has assembled the following county estimates of acreage, yield and production of soybeans harvested for beans for 1944, and 1945 preliminary in 18 soybean producing States. Similar estimates from 1939 through 1943 for most of these States are available in previous releases. These county estimates are a breakdown of the official State estimates and were prepared by the Agricultural Statisticians in the respective States. Although soybean production is estimated in 29 States, the 1945 production in the 18 States shown herein amounts to more than 99 percent of the United States production.
