Update Alert

Nuts, In-Shell: Pecans from 68,681 to 61,133, Total 95,689 to 88,141. Onions, other: from 29,884 to 29,966. Green Peas: from 394,638 to 394,557, Total frozen vegetables: from 1,580,809 to 1,580,810. Total commodities in coolers: from 2,720, 951 to 2,705,766. Percent to June 2001: from 82 to 83. Total commodities in freezers: from 10,251,060 to 10,251,061. Total commodities: 12,972,011 to 12,956,827. Nuts, Shelled: South Atlantic Region, Pecans, from 11,363 to 10,441; West South Central Region, Peanuts, from 101,069 to 100,961; Pecans, from 43,937 to 38,311. Nuts, In-Shell: South Atlantic Region, Pecans, from 16,423 to 15,058; East South Central Region, Pecans, from 2,120 to 2,728; West South Central Region, Pecans, from 50,285 to 43,314. Onions: Middle Atlantic Region, from 4,982 to 5,064. Green Peas: Middle Atlantic Region, from 64,467 to 64,386.

HIGHLIGHTS

Frozen food stocks in refrigerated warehouses on July 31, 2001, were greater than year earlier levels for potatoes, orange juice and turkeys. Cooler stocks of apples were also higher than a year earlier.

Butter stocks were 2 percent below June 2001 but were 6 percent above a year ago.

Total red meat supplies in freezers were 3 percent below June 2001 and were 20 percent below July 2000. Frozen pork stocks were 9 percent below last month and were 29 percent below last year. Stocks of pork bellies decreased 37 percent from last month and were 50 percent below July 2000 stocks.

Total frozen poultry supplies on July 31, 2001, were down 1 percent from last month and 12 percent below last year's level. Total stocks of chicken were 5 percent below last month and 21 percent below last year. Total pounds of turkey in freezers increased 6 percent from last month and were 2 percent above last year.


Public cooler occupancy on July 31, 2001, was at 42 percent of capacity, up 3 points from last year. Public freezer occupancy, at 53 percent, was down 5 percentage points from last year.



Survey Procedures: Questionnaires are mailed about the 24th of each month to all operators on the list of approximately 1,400 public and private cold storage warehouses. In addition, apple data are obtained from special surveys and other sources (State Departments of Agriculture, U.S. Apple Association, etc.). All survey data represent stocks as of the end of the month.

Data are collected from warehouses artificially cooled to a temperature of 50 degrees Fahrenheit or lower, and whose food products are normally stored for 30 days or more. All food items in these facilities are reported regardless of the number of days stored at the time of the report. Also included are specialized storage facilities meeting the 30 day requirement, such as fruit houses, dairy manufacturing plants, frozen fruit, fruit juice, and vegetable processors, and poultry and meat packing plants. Excluded are stocks in space maintained by wholesalers, jobbers, distributors, chain stores, locker plants containing individual lockers, meat packer branch houses, and frozen food processors whose entire inventories are turned over more than once a month.

Estimating Procedures: Data for reporting firms are added to estimates for non-reporting firms to obtain regional and National totals. Estimates for non-reporting firms are obtained by multiplying the previous month's figure by a percent change from the previous month. The percent change is calculated for each item from totals of the current and previous month summed from firms that reported both months.

Revision Policy: Data are revised the following month based on late reports or corrected data. Final figures are published in the annual summary in February of the following year.

Reliability: Reports are received from 900 firms each month which represent about 70 percent of the total capacity. Firms that are not on the list or firms who have never reported are not represented in the data. Monthly data can vary due to different firms reporting month to month. Survey data are also subject to non-sampling errors such as omissions and mistakes in reporting and in processing the data. While these errors cannot be measured directly, they are minimized by carefully reviewing all reported data for consistency and reasonableness.

The next "Cold Storage" report will be released at 3 p.m. ET on September 21, 2001.
