COLD STORAGE REPORT

AS OF DECEMBER 1, 1941

Reports from cold storage warehouses and meat-packing establishments to the United States Department of Agriculture indicate the following situation as of December 1:

Stocks of frozen fruits, frozen vegetables, butter, cheese, frozen eggs, frozen poultry, and frozen and cured beef were well in excess of holdings of these commodities on December 1, 1940, and the December 1936-40 five year average. On the other hand, fresh apples, shell eggs and frozen and cured pork stocks were well below those of a year ago and the five-year average. Lard holdings were below those of December 1, 1940 but considerably above the December 1 average.

Holdings of apples were slightly reduced from November 1, 1941, a departure from the usual increase during the month. Stocks of frozen fruits and berries were reduced by a net total of 14.4 million pounds. Frozen vegetable stocks showed a slight increase, apparently due to freezings of broccoli and spinach.

Butter stocks were reduced by 34 million pounds during the month, cheese by half a million, shell eggs by 2.2 million cases, and frozen eggs by 24 million pounds.

Frozen poultry holdings were increased by 44.5 million pounds, which is about normal for the season.

Stocks of frozen and cured beef were increased by 25.7 million pounds, pork by 39 million, and all frozen and cured meats by 75.6 million. Lard holdings were reduced by 1 million, however.

FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

FRESH FRUITS

Reports as of December 1 indicate a total of 31,105,000 bushels of apples on hand. This quantity is 2,733,000 bushels less than that on hand December 1, 1940, and 531,000 bushels less than the December 1, 1936-40, five-year average. Cooperators were asked to withhold from their reports figures on fruits intended for canning or other processing, so it is assumed that the above data represent stocks that will go into fresh fruit marketing channels. Included in total stocks are 3,090,000 bushels owned by the Surplus Marketing Administration and held in storages east of the Mississippi river.

FROZEN FRUITS

Stocks of frozen fruits and berries totaling 185,431,000 pounds exceeded those of a year earlier by 30,698,000 pounds, and the five-year average by 56,940,000 pounds. Of the total quantity reported 40,491,000 pounds were unclassified as to variety.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

Stocks of frozen vegetables were 15,042,000 pounds greater than those on hand December 1 a year ago. Of the 99,197,000 pounds reported 10,963,000 were unclassified by varieties.

DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

(12/12/1941)

During November creamery butter stocks were reduced by 34,109,000 pounds. This is about a normal movement for the period. December 1, 1941 totaling 152,526,000 pounds exceeded those of a year earlier by 84,928,000 and the 5 year 1936-40 average by 57,912,000 pounds. Included in the above total are 4,911,000 pounds owned by the Dairy Products Marketing Association and 140,000 pounds held by Surplus Marketing Administration, and Federal Surplus Commodities Corporation.

Stocks of cheese totaling 188,225,000 pounds were only slightly reduced from November 1 holdings. The cut-of-storage movement during November totaled one-half million pounds. December 1941 stocks exceeded those of December 1, 1940 by 50,836,000 and the five year average by 68,013,000 pounds. S. M. A. and F. S. C. C. reported holdings of 16,349,000 pounds of cheese which are included in the above figures.

Stocks of eggs were reduced during November by 2,200,000 cases of shell and 23,944,000 pounds of frozen. The 1,657,000 cases of shell reported for December 1 were 312,000 cases below those on hand a year earlier and 226,000 cases below the 5 year average. Frozen egg stocks totaling 129,899,000 pounds exceeded December 1940 holdings by 38,626,000 and the 5 year average by 41,018,000 pounds. S. M. A. and F. S. C. C. held 392,000 cases of shell and 26,163,000 pounds of frozen eggs.

Total stocks of all varieties of poultry increased during November by 44,455,000 pounds. This is about a normal seasonal movement comparing with 44,853,000 for November 1940 and 42,121,000 for the 5 year average. All poultry items with the exception of ducks showed increases.

MEATS AND LARD

Stocks of frozen and cured beef were increased during November by 25,7 million pounds. December 1, 1941 stocks which totaled 115.5 million pounds exceeded holdings on hand December 1, 1940 by 44 millions and the 5 year average 1936-40 by 35.8 million pounds. The bulk of the above stocks consisted of frozen beef which represented 85 percent of the total.

Stocks of frozen and cured pork increased during the month by 39 million pounds. This item totaling 352.3 million pounds was 56.6 million below December 1, 1940 stocks and 9.8 million pounds below the 5 year average.

Total frozen and cured meat holdings were 547 million pounds. This quantity is 3,4 million pounds below stocks on hand a year ago but 34 million pounds above average.

There was little change in the lard situation. December 1 stocks totaling 172 million pounds compared with 173 million for November 1. The December 1 holdings were 60.5 million below those of a year ago but 64.3 million pounds above average. In addition to the lard stocks there were approximately 5 million pounds of rendered pork fat on hand. Included in the above figures are 9,627,000 pounds of cured pork owned by the Surplus Marketing Administration and Federal Surplus Commodities Corporation. The Corporation owned no lard.
