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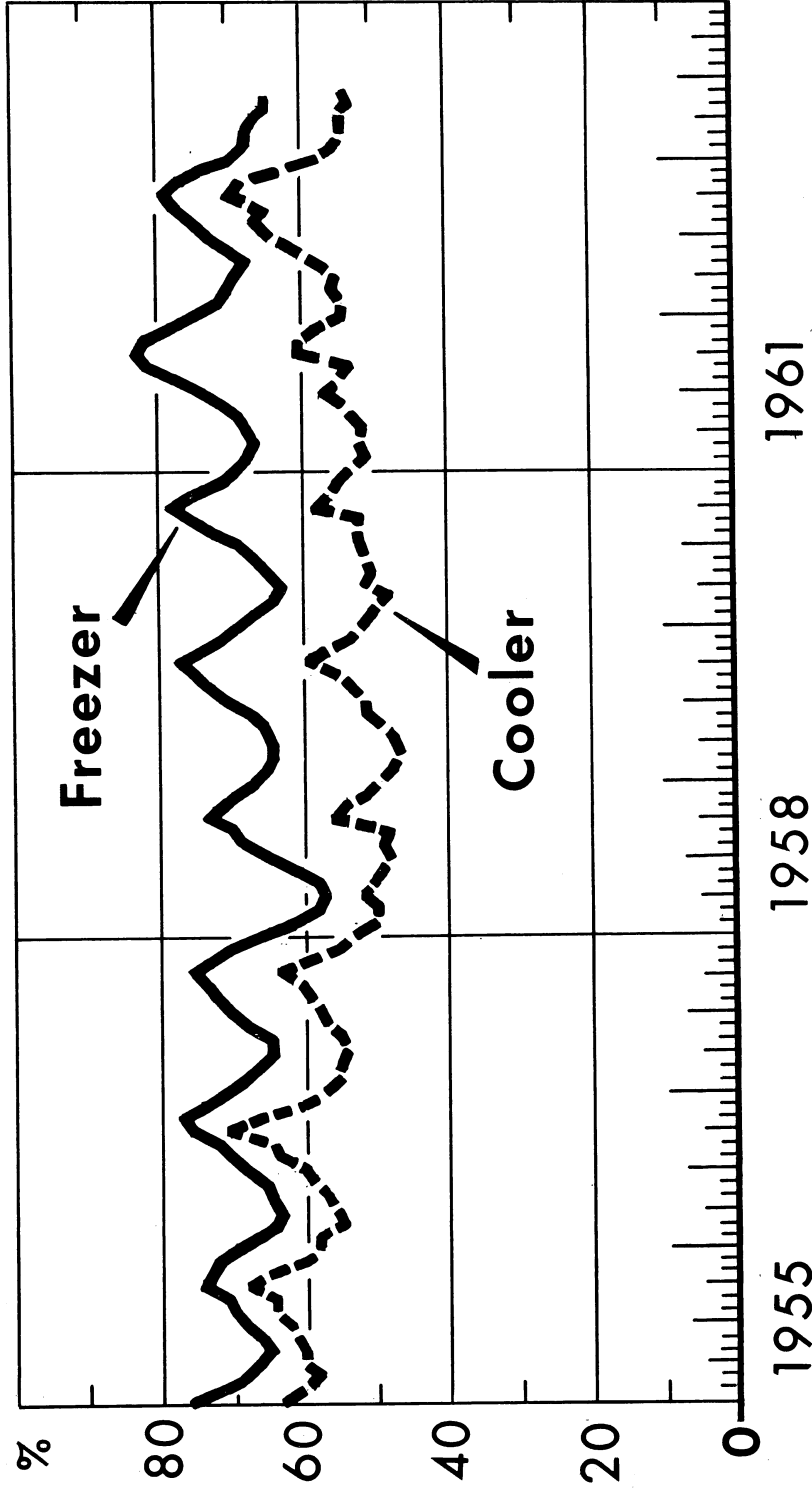

COLD STORAGE REPORT, JULY 1, 1963

Commodity summary

Refrigerated holdings in food warehouses totaled 4.9 billion pounds on July 1, about the same as a month ago, but 6 percent fewer than on July 1 last year, according to the Crop Reporting Board. The 1957-61 average stocks for July 1 are 4.2 billion pounds. Food holdings in cooler rooms decreased 31 million pounds during June to a record 1.5 billion for July 1, compared with 1.6 billion stored on July 1, 1962, the previous record high for the date. Freezer-held products advanced seasonally by 17 million pounds to 3.4 billion, still about 6 percent under the July 1 record high last year. Frozen vegetable stocks gained 4-million pounds during June bringing July 1 holdings to a record total of 946 million pounds. This exceeded by 77 million pounds the previous July 1 high established a year ago. Holdings of all vegetable items were above average for the date except for asparagus and cauliflower. Total frozen vegetable stocks were 9 percent larger than on this date last year and 48 percent above the July 1 average. Frozen fruit supplies rose 55 million pounds from June 1 to July 1, about 5 million less than a year earlier and 34 million fewer than average. July 1 stocks of 328 million pounds compared with 365 million last year and average holdings for the date of 370 million pounds. Except for gains in stocks of apricots, boysenberries, strawberries, and miscellaneous fruit items, stocks of other frozen fruit items declined seasonally. Orange concentrate holdings were reduced contraseasonally by 5 million gallons, leaving 43 million in storage on July 1. For this time of year, these supplies were 37 percent less than last year and 4 percent less than average. The usual stock gain during June is 300 thousand gallons but the June 1962 gain was 6 million gallons. An 18-million pound gain in butter stocks moved warehouse holdings up to 395 million pounds, 8 percent less than a year earlier but more than double the average for July 1. The 368 million pounds of American cheese compared with 454 million on July 1 last year and 350 million pounds the average. Shell egg stocks on July 1 were up to 280 thousand cases -- a gain of 80 thousand over the previous month. Warehouse holdings were below average by 73 percent and a year earlier by 29 percent. Frozen egg stocks did not increase as much as during June 1962 or the average. A 19-million pound upturn brought holdings to 102 million pounds, 8 percent under July 1 a year ago and 29 percent below average. Meats in storage decreased 43 million pounds during June to 618 million on July 1. This reduction was about average for the month but 30 million less than the June 1962 decline. Total holdings were larger than both a year earlier and average.

Cooler and freezer stock changes

Food holdings in cooler rooms decreased 31 million pounds during June to 1.5 billion on July 1. Seasonal gains in stocks were reported for pork, eggs, cheese, canned milk, and dried and evaporated fruits. However, these increases were more than offset by reductions in stocks of fresh fruits, vegetables, nuts, beef, and canned meats. Freezer-held products advanced during June -- 17 million pounds -- and on July 1 totaled 3.4 billion. This time last year, a 150-million-pound gain during June brought warehouse holdings to 3.6 billion pounds. Average holdings for July 1 are 3 billion pounds. Holdings of all freezer products moved up during June except for poultry, juices, pork, veal, lamb and mutton.

Storage occupancy in public warehouses

Occupancy of cooler space in public refrigerated warehouses gained 1 percentage point during June; however, freezer occupancy remained unchanged. Cooler occupancy was 54 percent of capacity on July 1 -- 2 points greater than average but 7 points less than July 1 last year. Freezer occupancy was 65 percent -- 5 points below a year earlier, and 2 percentage points under average.

Dairy and dairy products

Stocks of butter increased to 395 million pounds on July 1, increasing 18 million during June, or far less than the advance of 43 million a year earlier and the average June gain of 45 million. Government owned butter on July 1 totaled 354 million pounds, leaving 41 million in commercial channels, compared with 48 million a year earlier.

Holdings of American cheese rose to 368 million pounds on July 1 -- a gain of 25 million pounds during June. Stocks were 19 percent below July 1 a year ago, but 5 percent above average. Government holdings of American cheese totaled 33 million pounds -- 4 million more than on June 1.

Juices, vegetables, and fruits

July 1 stocks of frozen vegetables reached a new high for the date with 946 million pounds in storage. This was 9 percent larger than on July 1, 1962 and 48 percent above average. During June, frozen vegetable stocks advanced slightly -- 4 million pounds -- principally the result of gains in stocks of asparagus, peas, mixed peas and carrots, and spinach, which offset seasonal losses in other vegetable stocks. Orange concentrate stocks moved contraseasonally from storage and were down 5 million to 43 million gallons on July 1. This compared with 67 million a year earlier and 44 million, the average for July 1. With 328 million pounds in storage, frozen fruit supplies were 10 percent under July 1 last year and 11 percent below average. The June advance of 55 million pounds compared with 60 million last year and 89 million, the average for the month. Although stocks of only 4 fruit items increased during June -- apricots, boysenberries, strawberries, and miscellaneous fruits -- these gains were more than sufficient to offset seasonal losses in stocks of other fruits.

Poultry and poultry products

Frozen poultry supplies on July 1 were 178 million pounds, 13 percent less than a year earlier, but average for the date. Stocks of frozen poultry declined 6 million pounds during June, compared with a reduction of 15 million during June 1962 and 1 million, the average. Turkey holdings were 90 million pounds -- a decline of 6 million during June. The July 1 inventory was 26 percent below that date last year, but 10 percent above average. Supplies of frozen eggs on July 1 were 102 million pounds -- a gain of 19 million pounds from June 1. On July 1 last year, stocks were 111 million pounds and the average for this time of year is 144 million pounds. Stocks of shell eggs increased to 280,000 cases on July 1 -- an increase of 80 thousand cases during June. There were 397,000 cases in storage July 1 a year ago, while the average for the date is 1,039,000 cases.

Meat and meat products

Supplies of meat and meat products declined 43 million pounds during June to 618 million pounds on July 1. A year earlier, stocks declined 73 million pounds and the average June decline is 46 million pounds. Stocks were 21 percent more than both July 1, 1962 and average. Beef holdings were 186 million pounds, advancing 1 million pounds in contrast to a 19-million-pound reduction during June last year and the average decrease of 3 million. Stocks of pork were 9 percent above a year earlier and 15 percent above average. Frozen pork holdings were 283 million pounds, a decrease of 36 million pounds during the month, while cooler stocks were 37 million pounds or the same as on June 1. Supplies of frozen pork bellies on July 1 were 96 million pounds, compared with 112 million on June 1 and 91 million at this time last year.
