Hurricane "Isbell" passed across Florida the evening of October 14, damaging a large portion of the tomato acreage.

Winds from the southern edge of the storm whipped older plants in Dade County being grown for the mature green market. Many of the plants were badly laid over and these are not straightning up as fast as expected. Strong winds on Thursday and Friday following the storm caused additional damage. Light harvest is expected by mid-November. Plants in the Ft. Myers area escaped damage but the northern fringe of the storm hit fields in the Naples and Immokalee areas blowing plants over and scarring fruit. The Devils Garden area was closest to the storm center and plants were blown over, fruit scarred, and foliage badly burned by the high wind. Fruit is sizing well. Harvest on earliest fields is expected near the first of November.

Plant condition in the Ft. Pierce area is good in all but Martin and Palm Beach Counties which were affected by the storm. Most of the fields in these two counties were further advanced than usual. The majority of the fruit was blown off or scarred. Cool, dry weather after the storm has been beneficial.

Plants in the Manatee-Ruskin-Wauchula area escaped storm damage. Condition is mostly good. First harvest will start in late October.

Plant condition in the Pompano vine ripe area is generally poor. Winds from the hurricane stripped leaves from plants in the Lake Worth sector. Wind burn varied from moderate to severe in the remainder of this area. Most of the fruit on the older plants was blown off or badly scarred. Fields in the southern part of the vine ripe area with good wind breaks suffered only light to moderate damage. Come young acreage will probably be replanted but plants lost on older acreage will not be replanted.

This is the first weekly Tomato Report for the 1964-65 season.
