Processing Vegetables Down 10 Percent

Vegetable processors have contracted with U. S. farmers to grow 1.37 million acres of the four major vegetable crops (snap beans, sweet corn, green peas, and tomatoes). Planted acreage is down 10 percent from last year and 9 percent below two years ago.

Canning contracts cover 930,830 acres, a drop of 10 percent from last year and 8 percent below two years ago. Freezer contracted area covers 436,810 acres, an 8 percent decline from last year and 11 percent below two years ago.

Tomato acreage for canning dropped 24 percent, to 273,820 acres planted. Contract tonnage of 8.78 million tons is down 18 percent. Snap beans are planted on 205,620 contracted acres, a decline of 12 percent. Sweet corn acreage, at 535,300 acres, is down 5 percent, and green peas, totalling 352,900 acres, are off 1 percent from last year.

Snap Beans: Processors have contracted 205,620 acres of snap beans in 1992, down 12 percent from last year and 15 percent below two years ago. Canners planted 147,090 acres, a loss of 11 percent; while freezers acreage, at 58,530 acres, is off 14 percent. Indiana snap bean acreage, at 4,100 acres contracted, is up from last year but is well below two years ago. Neighboring Illinois indicates a 22 percent decrease. All other snap bean producing States are down from last year. Wisconsin is down 6 percent, Oregon is down 8 percent, Tennessee is down 10 percent, Pennsylvania is down 15 percent, New York is down 16 percent and Michigan is down 18 percent from last year's plantings. Harvest should be active by the last half of June.

Sweet Corn: Processing sweet corn is contracted on 535,300 acres this year, down 5 percent from a year ago but slightly above 1990. Canners are looking at 330,170 acres, a decline of 3 percent; while freezers plantings, at 205,130 acres, dropped 8 percent from last year. Six of the seven leading States planted less sweet corn than last year. Acreage is down 4 percent each in Wisconsin and Minnesota, down 3 percent in Washington, 9 percent in Oregon, 11 percent in Idaho, and off 15 percent in Illinois. New York processors indicate an increase of 2 percent. Michigan with 7,700 acres is up 15 percent but Pennsylvania and Delaware cuts will more than offset this increase.

Green Peas: Producers planted peas on 352,900 acres this year, down 1 percent from last year and 4 percent below two years ago. Canners contracts covering 179,750 acres, gained 5 percent from last year while freezers with 173,150 acres, are down 6 percent. Minnesota and Delaware show higher acreage than last year, while New York, Washington and Oregon are down. Wisconsin green pea acreage is the same as last year.

Tomatoes for Canning: Processors have contracted tomato planting on 273,820 acres this year, down 24 percent from the last two years. California processors estimate plantings at 240,000 acres under contract, 25 percent less than last year. Water shortage and low contract offerings are behind the cut. Early harvest began in the Desert at the end of May and should move to the San Joaquin Valley the third week of June, which would be a week to ten days ahead of normal. Michigan and Ohio production is expected to be down 3 and 4 percent, respectively, while Pennsylvania, Indiana, and New Jersey expect deeper cuts. Contract tonnage is forecast at 8.78 million tons, down 18 percent from last year and 14 percent below 1990.
