SHIPMENTS OF STOCKER AND FEEDER CATTLE AND SHEEP

Shipments into Selected North Central States

The number of stocker and feeder cattle and calves shipped into the 8 North Central States during August 1967 was 612 thousand head, up 6 percent from August 1966, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Of the total cattle and calves received in these 8 States during the month, 245 thousand head moved through public stockyards. This was an increase of 18 percent from August 1966. The number of cattle and calves received direct during the month was 368 thousand head, about the same as August 1966. Direct movement during August accounted for 60 percent of the total movement, compared with 64 percent a year earlier. Cattle and calves shipped into the 8 States during July and August 1967 amounted to 1.0 million head, 1 percent below the same period in 1966.

August shipments of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs into the 8 North Central States were 113 thousand head--down 51 percent from a year earlier. The 45 thousand head of sheep and lambs received through public stockyards during the month was 34 percent less than a year earlier, and the 68 thousand head received direct was 58 percent less than August 1966. During the period July-August 1967, the number of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs shipped into the 8 States was 189 thousand head, down 43 percent from the 334 thousand head shipped during the same months of 1966.

Stocker and Feeder Cattle and Sheep from Public Stockyards

Inspected shipments of stocker and feeder cattle and calves from public stockyards during August 1967 totaled 577 thousand head, 13 percent above those shipped during August 1966.

Shipments of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs inspected at public stockyards during August 1967 amounted to 95 thousand head--down 30 percent from the 135 thousand head inspected a year earlier. Stocker and Feeder Cattle and Sheep Received in Selected North Central States
