Shipments into Selected North Central States

The number of stocker and feeder cattle and calves shipped into the 8 North Central States during March 1968 was 472 thousand head, up 3 percent from March 1967, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Of the total cattle and calves received in these 8 States during the month, 168 thousand head moved through public stockyards. This was a decrease of 7 percent from March 1967. The number of cattle and calves received direct in March 1968 was 305 thousand head, 9 percent more than a year earlier. Direct movement during March accounted for 64 percent of the total movement, 3 percentage points above a year earlier. Cattle and calves shipped into the 8 States during January-March 1968 amounted to 1.4 million head, 5 percent above the first quarter of 1967.

March shipments of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs into the 8 North Central States were 75 thousand head -- up 6 percent from a year earlier. The 20 thousand head of sheep and lambs received through public stockyards during the month was 7 percent less than in March 1967, and the 54 thousand head received direct was 11 percent more than a year earlier. During January-March 1968, the number of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs shipped into the 8 States was 249 thousand head, up 10 percent from the 226 thousand during the first quarter of 1967.

Stocker and Feeder Cattle and Sheep from Public Stockyards

Inspected shipments of stocker and feeder cattle and calves from public stockyards during March 1968 were 438 thousand head, I percent more than the 434 thousand head shipped during March 1967.

Shipments of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs inspected at public stockyards in March 1968 totaled 31 thousand -- down 19 percent from the 38 thousand head inspected a year earlier.
