

SHIPMENTS OF STOCKER AND FEEDER CATTLE AND SHEEP
SEPTEMBER 1964

Shipments into Selected North Central States

The number of stocker and feeder cattle and calves shipped into the 8 North Central States during September 1964 was 861 thousand head, up 21 percent from September last year, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Of the total cattle and calves received in these 8 States during the month, 269 thousand head moved through public stockyards. This was an increase of 22 percent from September 1963. The number of cattle and calves received direct in September 1964 was 591 thousand head, 20 percent more than the same month last year. The direct movement in September accounted for 69 percent of the total, the same as a year earlier. Cattle and calves shipped into the 8 States during July-September 1964 totaled 1.8 million head, 19 percent more than for the same months in 1963.

September shipments of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs into the 8 North Central States were 433 thousand head -- up 2 percent from a year earlier. The 64 thousand head of sheep and lambs received through public stockyards during the month was down 13 percent from September 1963; however, the 369 thousand head received direct was 5 percent more than a year earlier. During July-September 1964, the number of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs shipped into the 8 States was 925 thousand head -- up 20 percent from the total for these months last year.

Stocker and Feeder Cattle and Sheep from Public Stockyards

Inspected shipments of stocker and feeder cattle and calves from public stockyards during September 1964 were 607 thousand head, 6 percent more than the 572 thousand head shipped in during September 1963.

Shipments of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs inspected at public stockyards in September 1964 totaled 242 thousand head -- down 9 percent from the 265 thousand head inspected a year earlier.
