Shipments into Selected North Central States

The number of stocker and feeder cattle and calves shipped into the 8 North Central States during April 1964 was 355 thousand head, down 27 percent from April last year, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Of the total cattle and calves received in these 8 States during the month, 139 thousand moved through public stockyards -- down 25 percent from April 1963. The number of cattle and calves received direct in April 1964 was 216 thousand head, 29 percent less than the same month last year. The direct movement in April was 61 percent of the total, compared with 62 percent a year earlier. Cattle and calves shipped into the 8 States during January-April 1964 totaled 1.6 million head, 12 percent more than the total for the same period in 1963.

April shipments of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs into the 8 North Central States were 171 thousand head -- up 25 percent from a year earlier. The 31 thousand head of sheep and lambs received through public stockyards during the month was 66 percent more than in April 1963, and the 140 thousand head received direct was 19 percent more than a year earlier. During January-April 1964, the number of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs shipped into the 8 States was 593 thousand head -- up 16 percent from the total for these months last year.

Stocker and Feeder Cattle and Sheep from Public Stockyards

Inspected shipments of stocker and feeder cattle and calves from public stockyards during April 1964 were 340 thousand head, 21 percent less than the 428 thousand head shipped in April 1963.

Shipments of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs inspected at public stockyards in April 1964 were slightly more than 65 thousand head -- down 5 percent from the 69 thousand head inspected a year earlier.
