

FLUID MILK AND CREAM REPORT

DECEMBER 1968

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MILK PRICE AND SALES HIGHLIGHTS

December prices paid by dealers for milk used for fluid purposes (Class I) averaged \$6.65 per hundredweight for about 170 markets. This was unchanged since October but 32 cents above December 1967. Regional averages for early December ranged from 2 to 55 cents above December 1967, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

Store prices to consumers in 25 cities in early December averaged 53½ cents per half gallon for the most common grade of whole milk. This was about the same as October and November but more than 2 cents above December 1967. Home-delivered half gallons for the 25 cities averaged about 60½ cents in December--up slightly from November and 3 cents above December 1967. The home-delivered prices are list prices before deductions for quantity discounts.

Preliminary data on total sales of fluid products for October in about 70 marketing areas averaged 3 percent above a year earlier--October 1968 had one less Sunday than in 1967. Revised September sales were 2 percent below September 1967. Total sales during January-October were about 1 percent above the same period a year earlier. Continued increased sales of low-fat and skim milk items more than offset declines in whole milk and cream sales.

PRICES IN FLUID MILK MARKETS

New England: Dealers' Class I prices averaged \$7.31 per hundredweight in early December--unchanged from November but 53 cents above a year earlier. Consumer prices, both at stores and home-delivered, were unchanged from November.

Middle Atlantic: Class I milk prices averaged \$7.19 per hundredweight in early December--unchanged since October but 55 cents above December 1967. Except for changes in price ranges, consumer prices held at October levels.

"Effective January 1, 1969, the Statistical Reporting Service plans to discontinue calculation and publication of 5-year averages that appear in this report. The report will contain data for the current and the two preceding years. It is believed that changes in agriculture have decreased the value of the five-year averages for making comparisons."

East North Central: Dealer prices for fluid-use milk averaged \$6.06 per hundredweight in early December--unchanged since October but 18 cents above December 1967. Consumer prices continued near November levels for the region.

West North Central: Dealers' Class I prices averaged \$6.00 per hundredweight in early December--unchanged since October but 31 cents above December 1967. Consumer prices held at November levels.

South Atlantic: Class I milk prices paid by dealers in early December averaged \$7.04 per hundredweight--unchanged since October but 31 cents above December 1967. Store and home-delivered prices to consumers were unchanged for most markets.

East South Central: Dealer prices for Class I milk averaged \$6.06 per hundredweight in early December--unchanged since October but 13 cents above December 1967. Prices to consumers held at November levels in most markets.

West South Central: Class I milk prices averaged \$7.25 per hundredweight in early December--unchanged since October but 29 cents above December 1967. Except for changes in price ranges, consumer prices held at November levels.

Mountain: Dealer prices averaged \$6.06 per hundredweight for fluid-use milk in early December--unchanged from November but 29 cents above December 1967. Consumer prices continued near November levels.

Pacific: Class I prices paid by dealers averaged \$5.87 per hundredweight in early December--unchanged from November and 2 cents above December 1967. Consumer prices continued at November levels.

SALES OF FLUID DAIRY PRODUCTS AND RECEIPTS OF MILK FROM PRODUCERS

Total fluid items: For September, total sales were 2 percent below a year earlier. Increased sales in late August were made in preparation for the Labor Day weekend at the start of September. In addition, there was one less sales day due to the extra Sunday in September 1968. The sales data represent about 70 marketing areas.

Whole milk: Sales of whole milk during September were about 4 percent below a year earlier.

Low-fat and skim milk: September sales of low-fat and skim milk items averaged 11 percent above a year earlier.

Milk and cream mixtures: Sales of mixtures (mostly half and half) were down 9 percent from September 1967.

Cream items: Cream sales during September were down 7 percent from a year earlier.

Milk receipts: October receipts of milk from producers at plants regulated for about 70 marketing areas averaged about the same as last month but up 2 percent from a year earlier.

Milk production: November milk production was estimated at 8,793 million pounds--about equal to a year earlier. November production provided 1.45 pounds of milk per person daily for all uses, compared with 1.47 pounds a year earlier.
