PRICES IN FLUID MARKETS

January prices paid by dealers for milk used for fluid purposes averaged \$6.33 per hundredweight for 176 markets, according to the Crop Reporting Board. The average for early January 1968 is unchanged from December 1967 but is 18 cents above a year earlier. By regions, prices ranged from 2 to 32 cents above a year earlier.

Store prices to consumers for the most common grade of whole milk sold in 25 cities averaged 51.4 cents per half gallon in early January. This was up slightly from December 1967 and nearly 1 cent above January 1967. Home-delivered quart prices for the 25 cities averaged 31.6 cents in January--about unchanged since October 1967 but nearly 1 cent above a year earlier.

In New England, dealers' Class I prices averaged \$6.78 per hundredweight for January 1968--unchanged from a month earlier but 5 cents under a year earlier. Consumer prices for milk purchases in stores and home-delivered were mostly unchanged from a month earlier in the region. Most significant changes were 1 to 3 cent per quart increases for store sales in Concord, New Hampshire and 1 to 2 cent increases for home-delivery milk in the Augusta-Portland, Maine area.

Class I milk prices in the Middle Atlantic States averaged \$6.64 per hundredweight for January--unchanged since October 1967 but 12 cents above a year earlier. Consumer prices in the region were mostly unchanged from December except in several New York markets where they were 1 cent per quart higher.

Dealers' prices for fluid-use milk in the East North Central Region averaged \$5.88 per hundredweight in January 1968--the same as October, November, and December 1967 but 24 cents per hundredweight above January 1967. Consumer prices, both at stores and home delivered, were generally steady in Ohio and most of Wisconsin and Indiana. Out-of-store prices generally ranged higher than a month earlier in most Michigan and Illinois markets.

In the West North Central Region, dealers' Class I prices averaged \$5.69 per hundredweight in early January 1968--unchanged from the November and December 1967 levels but 32 cents above January 1967. Consumer prices were mostly unchanged except in North Dakota where prices ranged from unchanged to 2 cents per quart higher for both out-of-store and home-delivered milk.

Class I prices paid by dealers in the South Atlantic Region for January 1968 averaged \$6.74 per hundredweight--about the same as for December 1967 but 8 cents above January 1967. Consumer prices, both at stores and home delivered, generally declined from December 1967 levels in Huntington, West Virginia but were mostly unchanged for the rest of the South Atlantic region.

In the East South Central Region, dealer buying prices averaged \$6.47 per hundredweight--unchanged since October 1967 but 25 cents above January 1967. Retail prices were mostly unchanged from December 1967 levels.

West South Central Class I milk prices averaged \$6.98 per hundredweight in early January--unchanged from December 1967 but 29 cents above January 1967. Consumer prices continued mostly unchanged from December levels except in Texas where both out-of-store and home-delivered prices ranged upward for most markets.

In the Mountain Region, dealers paid an average of \$6.31 per hundredweight for Class I milk in early January 1968. This was unchanged from a month earlier and 2 cents above January 1967. Out-of-store and home-delivered milk prices continued unchanged except in the Albuquerque, New Mexico area where they averaged up to 3 cents per quart higher.

Dealers in the Pacific Region paid an average of \$5.85 per hundredweight of Class I milk in early January. This was the same as for December 1967 but 23 cents above January 1967. Retail prices to consumers, both out-of-store and home-delivered were unchanged from December 1967.

SALES OF FLUID DAIRY PRODUCTS AND RECEIPTS OF MILK FROM PRODUCERS

Whole milk sales for 76 regulated marketing areas during October 1967 averaged 91.2 million pounds per day, down 3 percent from a year earlier. For the January through October 1967 period, average daily sales were down 3 percent from the same 10-month period in 1966. October 1967 daily sales of skim milk in 75 markets averaged 12 percent above a year earlier. Skim milk sales during the first 10 months of 1967 also averaged 12 percent above the same period for 1966.

Milk and cream mixture sales (mostly half and half) on a daily basis in 74 regulated areas averaged 5 percent less for October 1967 compared with a year earlier and 3 percent less than September 1967. Daily average sales for other cream products during October in 74 marketing areas were nearly 5 percent below a year earlier and 2 percent below September 1967.

Combined daily sales of all fluid milk products during October 1967 averaged 92.0 million pounds per day. This compares with 92.5 million pounds a year earlier and 93.8 million pounds per day during September 1967. Preliminary data for November 1967 sales of total fluid items averaged 92.8 million pounds per day -- 1 percent below a year earlier.

November receipts of milk from producers at regulated plants (74 marketing areas) averaged 129.3 million pounds per day--about 1 percent less than November 1966. Daily receipts per producer averaged 1,002 pounds during November 1967 compared with 964 pounds a year earlier.

December 1967 milk production in the United States was estimated at 9,304 million pounds--2 percent less than a year earlier and 5 percent below the 1961-65 average for the month. December milk output provided 1.50 pounds of milk per person daily, compared with 1.48 pounds a month earlier and 1.55 pounds a year earlier.

Preliminary estimates of monthly production for the year 1967 totaled 119,583 million pounds--down 1 percent from 1966 and 5 percent below the 1961-65 average.
