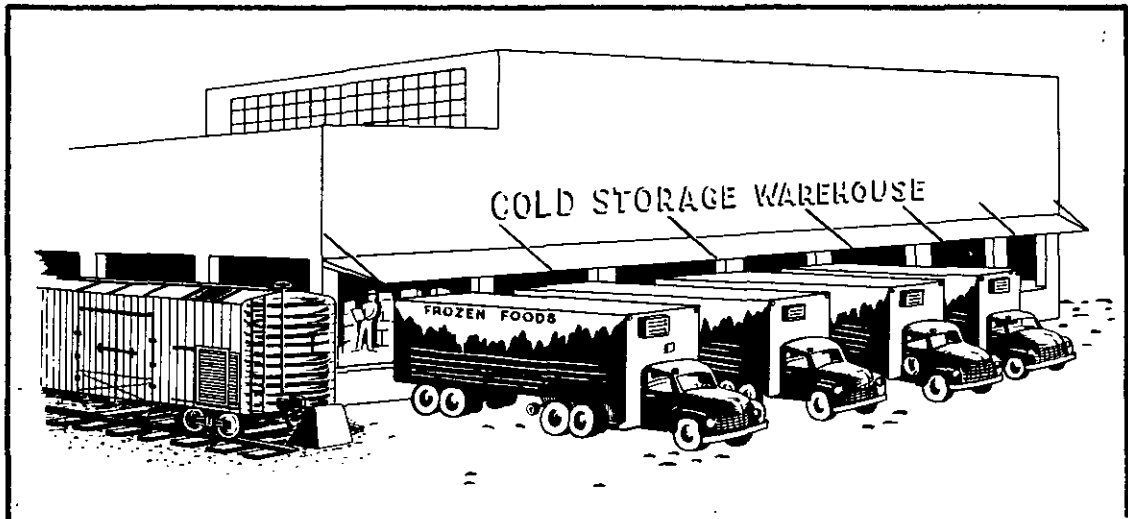

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CAPACITY OF REFRIGERATED WAREHOUSES
IN THE UNITED STATES
OCTOBER 1, 1969

Capacity of U. S. refrigerated storage totaled 1,353 million cubic feet on October 1, 1969--largest of record, according to the Crop Reporting Board. This is the 25th in a biennial series of surveys.

Total gross storage capacity increased 59 million cubic feet in 2 years, while the number of refrigerated plants decreased from 3,459 to 3,343. Middle Atlantic and East South Central were the only regions that showed decreased storage capacity from October 1, 1967.

Greatest gain was in the Pacific Region, where capacity totaled 401 million gross cubic feet, 19 million more than on October 1, 1967.

Capacities and changes in other regions were as follows: South Atlantic--capacity 202 million, up 16 million gross cubic feet; West South Central--68 million, up 9 million; East North Central--200 million, up 8 million; Mountain--42 million, up 6 million; New England--70 million, up 4 million; West North Central--143 million, up 3 million gross cubic feet; Middle Atlantic--190 million, down 4 million; and East South Central--33 million gross cubic feet, down 2 million.

Public warehouses: Warehouse space maintained for public use continued an uptrend, unbroken since the first survey of 1921. The capacity totaled 730 million gross cubic feet, an increase of 29 million cubic feet since 1967. The number of public warehouses totaled 792--a decline of 25 plants since 1967.

Over half of the total gain in public warehouse space occurred in the West North Central and South Atlantic Regions--10 million gross cubic feet in the West North Central Region; 8 million in the South Atlantic. Greatest gain in the West North Central region was Kansas' increase of 9 million cubic feet.

West South Central advanced 7 million cubic feet; East North Central 5 million; and Pacific 4 million cubic feet. New England, Middle Atlantic, and Mountain Regions had less public storage capacity in 1969 than in 1967.

All States had at least one public warehouse. California had the most with 91 plants, totaling 81 million cubic feet of space. New York was second with 54 million followed by Illinois with 52 million and Kansas 51 million cubic feet.

Private and semiprivate warehouses: A gain of 19 million cubic feet brought the private and semiprivate storage capacity to 296 million cubic feet, 7 percent more than October 1, 1967. Plant numbers, however, decreased to 757, a drop of 3.

Gross storage capacity advanced in the 2-year period in six of the nine regions. Almost one-third of the private and semiprivate capacity was in the three Pacific Coast States; one-fourth in the South Atlantic; and 12 percent in the Middle Atlantic region.

Meatpacking plants: Storage space in the meatpacking plants declined to 36 million cubic feet by October 1, 1969, a net loss of 6 million during the 2 years. This industry's storage capacity continues to decline substantially. In 1949 capacity was 116 million cubic feet, and by 1959 it was down to 51 million.

Apple houses: Almost 291 million cubic feet of storage space was maintained for apples and other fruit on October 1, 1969, a gain of 10 percent from the previous survey year. The largest increase was in the Pacific region, up 12 million cubic feet from October 1, 1967.

Controlled atmosphere (CA) capacity was equivalent to 21.6 million bushels, compared with 17.3 million in 1967. Washington had over one-third of the total; New York 17 percent; and Michigan 15 percent.

Freezer capacity: Gross freezer capacity (0°F. or below) totaled 771 million cubic feet, up 8 percent from 1967. This continues the consistent uptrend in freezer capacity in each survey since 1945. Freezer space represented 57 percent of total refrigerated space in 1969, compared with 55 percent in 1967 and 54 percent in 1965.

The geographical distribution of freezer space showed about the same pattern as in 1967. The Pacific region continues to lead with 183 million cubic feet, followed by the South Atlantic with 120 million, the West North Central with 105 million, and the East North Central with 100 million.

Cooler capacity: Cooler space (0° to 50° F.) in all types of warehouses totaled 582 million cubic feet, up slightly from the 1967 total. An 8 percent increase in cooler space in private and semiprivate apple houses offset declines from 1967 in all other types of warehouses. In some cases, changes from the 1967 totals resulted when warehouses shifted from public to private operation.

The 3 Pacific States accounted for 37 percent of the U. S. total cooler space in 1969, followed by the East North Central region with 17 percent and the Middle Atlantic with 16 percent.

Capacity by cities: U. S. cities with 3 or more refrigerated warehouses and at least 3 million cubic feet totaled 48, according to the 1969 survey. These cities had 843 plants with gross capacity of 564 million cubic feet. This was 25 percent of the total number of plants in the U. S., and 42 percent of the total capacity.

Kansas City and Chicago, with 55 and 49 million gross cubic feet respectively, were by far the leading metropolitan areas for the cold storage industry. Rochester had 27 million cubic feet, Los Angeles - Long Beach, 25; and New York 23 million cubic feet; completing the list of five cities leading in refrigerated capacity. These locations were also prime centers for public general warehouses.

Forty-eight cities had 3 or more public warehouses and at least 2 million cubic feet of usable piling space. The combined gross capacity of 431 million cubic feet in these public warehouses was 32 percent of total U. S. storage space, and 59 percent of all public general capacity.

Definitions: The terms used in this report are defined as follows:

Warehouses: Facilities having refrigerated space artificially cooled to temperatures of 50°F. or lower, holding food stocks for 30 days or more. Space in warehouses operated by wholesalers, jobbers, retailers, or other businesses holding food products less than 30 days is not included. Excluded, too, was refrigerated space in locker plants, hotels, and military establishments.

To insure reliable capacity coverage, effort was made to include space in all known public, private, and semiprivate refrigerated facilities. These facilities included one-product houses handling fish, fruits, vegetables, meats, or dairy and refrigerated rooms maintained by frozen food processors for storage purposes.

Public warehouses: Any artificially cooled warehouse operated to store food commodities for others for pay.

Private warehouses: Any artificially cooled warehouse operated as a warehousing business to facilitate the main function of a producer, processor, or distributor, but not to store commodities for others for pay.

Semiprivate warehouses: Any artificially cooled warehouse used partly to store the owner's commodities and, in addition, to store various food commodities for others for pay.

Meatpacking establishment: Any plant engaged in processing dressed animal products for food. For this report and survey, only the space used for storing products is included. Refrigerated working space, chill rooms, and coolers used exclusively for handling dressed carcasses prior to shipping, as well as smoking and curing rooms are excluded.

Apple house: Any artificially cooled warehouse -- public, private, or semiprivate -- operated mainly or exclusively to store apples or pears.

Gross space: Space inside refrigerated rooms, measured from wall to wall and floor to ceiling, excluding elevators, stairs, vestibules, and like enclosures.

Usable piling space: Space for storing commodities; that is, space inside rooms measured wall to wall and floor to ceiling, minus the space provided for ventilation (outside of pile), space occupied by coils, aisles, posts, sprinklers, and the like.

Number of plants: The number of individual plant locations. Company plants of different address within a city or State, and plants having different intra-company designations are counted separately.

Cities: Standard metropolitan statistical areas as defined by the Bureau of the Budget, 1964. Generally, they are areas with at least one city with 50,000 or more population and will include the entire county of the central city and adjacent counties that are metropolitan in character and economically and socially integrated with the county of the central city.
