#### JANUARY FARM WAGES AVERAGED \$6.00 PER HOUR

There were 2.61 million people working on the Nation's farms and ranches during the week of January 6-12, 1991, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. Self-employed farm operators accounted for 1.40 million of the total, along with 339,000 unpaid workers, and 706,000 workers hired directly by farm operators. Agricultural service employees working on farms and ranches made up the remaining 168,000 workers.

Farm operators paid their hired workers an average wage of \$6.00 per hour during the January 1991 survey week. This rate was up 30 cents from a year earlier. Workers paid on an hourly basis earned \$5.62 per hour compared with \$5.30 last January. Field workers received an average of \$5.69 per hour, up 35 cents from the January 1990 survey week. Livestock workers earned \$5.32 compared with \$4.99 per hour a year earlier.

Self-employed farm operators worked an average of 30.5 hours, 0.1 hour less than the comparable week in 1990. Unpaid workers averaged 32.5 hours, 0.2 hours above last year. Hired employees worked 37.9 hours, the same number of hours as last January.

Benefits, such as housing and meals, were provided to 45 percent of the hired workers during the survey week. This compares with 46 percent during the January 1990 survey week. Six percent of the workers received both housing and meals, and another 15 percent received housing, but no meals.

#### FARM ACTIVITIES DURING SURVEY WEEK

Rain and above normal temperatures dominated the weather in the Delta and most of the East during the farm labor survey week of January 6-12, 1991. Rains were especially heavy from eastern Texas to the Florida Panhandle. Mostly dry weather prevailed in the rest of the Nation except in the Pacific Northwest which received heavy rains late in the week. Rain slowed pecan harvest in eastern Texas. Vegetable harvests continued in the Rio Grande Valley and San Antonio-Winter Garden areas. In California, producers harvested desert grapefruit, lemons, dates, and vegetables. Some Naval oranges were being selectively picked after the freeze. Early and mid-season orange harvests were active in Florida. Winter vegetable harvests were gaining momentum. Mixed vegetable and citrus harvests continued in Arizona.

#### SOURCE AND RELIABILITY OF ESTIMATES


The estimates of agricultural labor are based on multiple frame probability surveys. The surveys utilize two sampling frames — a list frame and an area frame. The list sample is a stratified random sample of producers likely to have hired farm workers. A probability sample from the area frame is used to estimate for any employers not on the list. The multiple frame approach assures all employers are represented by the combined samples.

Standard error, or relative sampling error, is a statistical measure of the variation that occurs by chance because of sampling. The true value is expected to be within the range of two standard errors below to two standard errors above the survey indication nineteen times out of twenty.

At the U.S. level, the number of all non-salaried workers and hired workers had relative sampling errors of 2.1 and 4.3 percent, respectively. Relative errors at the regional level for hired workers generally ranged between 10 and 20 percent. The all hired farm worker wage rate had a relative sampling error of 1.3 percent at the U.S. level. The relative sampling error for hourly paid workers was 1.2 percent and was 1.1 percent for the combined field and livestock worker wage rate.

Sampling errors for wage rates published by type of farm and economic class of farm ranged between 4.0 and 6.0 percent at the regional level.

#### DISTRIBUTION OF FIELD AND LIVESTOCK WORKERS, BY TYPE OF FARM, 48 STATES 1/



#### AGRICULTURAL SERVICES

Crew leaders and custom crews provided 168,000 workers for the Nation's farms and ranches during the week of January 6-12, 1991. Service workers in California numbered 57,000 compared with 45,000 during the January 1990 survey week. Florida's number increased to 11,000 this year from 10,000 service workers last January.

The average wages received by agricultural service workers in California and Florida were \$5.90 and \$6.60 per hour, respectively. Comparable wages in January 1990 were \$6.20 in California and \$6.23 in Florida.
